- 5. Heitkemper/ Elliott moved to allow for a 1-foot variance for Dennis Roach at 581 Flambeau Ave as recommended by the Phillips Zoning Board of Adjustments and Appeals. Carried

 - a. Potential for a Dog Park. Paul Precour presented the idea of a dog park at the new ballpark complex being built. This would be at no cost to the City other than maybe in the future asking for some old fire hydrants or benches to add to the park. Jeff Spacek will be putting up the leftover fencing from the old fields. The dog part would be two sections, 1 for smaller dogs, and 1 for larger dogs. Stephan raised concerns about the dog waste disposal. The council members were on board for the idea.

The City could lower the speed limit on that section down to 35 mph, but the DOT will not reduce it so that is why both City and County need to be on board.
