Board of Public Works/Recreation -Klimowski/Tomaszewski

- 8. DPW and Water/Sewer Updates:
 - Water/Sewer: Going well, upgrade is probably in the last 3 weeks at the plant. There was a leak on Hwy 13 that got repaired last week Thursday.
 - DPW: Starting off the year with a lot of breakdowns. Did a lot of snow removal today. Was approached by someone interested in doing a fundraiser for new playground equipment at the park and someone looking to do arches for winter (approximately Nov-Winterfest) on the walking trail down at Elk lake Park.
- 9. Discussion/Potential action regarding County Rd D construction, adding curb and gutter. Jeff Williams presented the Council with an estimated cost for doing curb and gutter on County Rd D. He explained that the County is looking for a 50% contribution, roughly \$13,500, to add curb and gutter there. Council questioned the City's benefit from adding curb and gutter and decided not spend money on the project that was no benefit to the City other than beautification. Heitkemper/ Tomaszewski moved to deny the request from the County to add curb and gutter on County Rd D.

- 10. Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Update:

 - a. Discussion/Action regarding fire department building condition. There is some cracking on the front of the building that is concerning to the fire department. Right now they have it foamed to prevent any heat loss, but they would like it checked out to see if it's a structural issue. Ayres will provide a quote for next weeks Common Council Agenda.
 - b. Discussion/Action regarding fee schedule. Fire Department presented their fee schedule, there were some requests for wording changes and some discussion on lift assists to Care facilities. Next week's agenda.
 - c. Discussion/Action regarding new fire truck: Fire department informed the council of the need for a new fire truck that was schedule to be purchased in 2025; however, in January of 2024 emissions will be changing, thus increasing prices of fire trucks. Production of the trucks is extremely backed up right now as well so in order to get one before 2024 you would have to get it ordered in the next coming months. It was suggested maybe we look into some funding to see if there is a potential to combine a new truck and a fire building expansion due to use needing to order custom trucks to fit the length of the building.
