The meeting was called to order by Mayor Peterson at 5:30 p.m. Those present included:

Public Comment: Joesph Fox came before the board and passed out three documents pertaining to the library, with concerns regarding the Library budgeting and some concerning books that were located in the Library.

6. Short Presentation from Lyn Ludwig regarding EPA Community Change Grant program. 20mins: Lyn presented the council with a website for a link for a survey, they have some community meetings set for Wednesday the March 20th and April 3rd 5:30. There needs to be a partnership between the non-profit (the applicant) and the city, if they become the statutory partnership.

All sorts of participation with the public to come throughout the process.

Stephan – questioned who controls the money received from the grant. Ludwig explained that the non-profit is who gets the money.

Looking to apply in late April, and within 1 month you should hear if you get interviewed, the interview would be scored, it would be another 6 weeks to hear if they got it or if they need to adjust their application. They have until November to apply but applications come on a first come first serve basis.

Patty Stephan member of the public questioned Ludwig how old the non-profit was and what projects they have worked on so far, Ludwig responded that they were established in 2022, Cherly Moore and Blake pluemer are board members, and so far applied for the DOT transportation grant worth 1.5 million in October and submitted in December. Brzeskiewicz questions what's next step if they do get the money.

Kosmer passed along the opinion of City Attorney Bryce Schoenborn that this is a lowrisk agreement, Kosmer emphasized the main requirement from the City is the attendance of the meetings.

Elliott/ Brzeskiewicz moved to enter into a statutory partnership with Price County United for the EPA Community Change Grant. Roll Call: Clark – aye, Heitkemper – absent, Brzeskiewicz – aye, Stephan – aye, Elliott -aye, Klimowski – aye. Motion Carried
